

# An arts & crafts activity

# Making a Paper Plate Cow

#### **Materials**

- 1 paper plate
- Black and pink construction paper—or you can color the ears and spots with markers
- Markers or paint
- 2 googly eyes if you have them—or you can draw the eyes with marker
- Scissors—parent help needed for most of our preschoolers
- Glue

#### Instructions

Cut several round/oval pieces of black paper in various sizes for the cow's spots.

The spots do not need to be perfect.

Cut one large pink circle for the cow's face.

Cut two tear drop shaped pieces of black paper for the cow's ears,

Cut two pink pieces of the same shape, but slightly smaller for the inner part of the ear.

Cut a "U"shape for the tongue.

Set out the plate, pieces of paper, googly eyes and glue and make a paper plate cow.

When it looks like a cow to you, you are all done!

### **Animal Enrichment Story**

One time Miss Ren took her fifth grade class on a field trip to the Point Defiance Zoo in Tacoma. While they were in the viewing area above the polar bears' habitat, a zookeeper carrying a bag of giant marshmallows asked if they wanted to help with Polar Bear Enrichment.

Each fifth grader got to throw one giant marshmallow into the enclosure below, and the class watched the polar bears run around and dive into the water and playfully grab all the marshmallows.

The zookeeper said when animals are in an enclosed area they need help playing, exploring and having new experiences.

#### **Materials**

Legos and baseboard

Or recycled materials

Or any other building and decorating materials

#### Instructions

- 1. Choose a farm animal
- 2. Build a habitat for your farm animal: a pasture, barn, chicken coop, burrow, etc.
- 3. Think about the enrichment your farm animal needs when it is cooped up: your farm animal needs to play, explore, and have new experiences
